Council rescinds motion on contract, tables ordinance changes

A motion and second to approve a contract with a grant -writing service was withdrawn for lack of complete documentation at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Ald. Kellie Ferrell had hoped to get approved for an ongoing services agreement with The Grant Helpers, Champaign-based small firm of experienced grant writers for entities that need the service but don't have grant writers on staff.

A motion by Ferrell and seconded by Ald. Stephen Eyrich, to pay The Grant Writers \$75 per hour in the ongoing agreement was withdrawn before a vote because the document was not available for aldermen to review.

More information on the company was unavailable as

its website, www.grantwriters.com, led to a link owned by Thirdside, a web design company. The link address included information that The Grant Writers' web page is suspended.

Ferrell then withdrew two other agenda items, revising the food truck and shipping container ordinances approved at the May 16 meeting.

In other business, the council voted 6-0, with Ald. Joe Garrett absent, to approve a proposal for services from Gary Burgett of Urbana-based Smith-Burgett Architects to provide recommendations on the planned downtown demolition project.

said a firm was first sought to make recommendations on making sure two buildings, connected to structures planned for destruction, were not damaged. "None of us is a demolition expert," he said.

Ferrell made the motion, seconded by Ald. Michael Ferrell. In following discussion, Eyrich said the cost of Burgett's services will be \$19,500. "It's no secret what we have to spend on this," he said.

In other unanimous action, the council approved the annual Motor Fuel Tax resolution. Finance chairman, Ald. Bob Porth made the motion to approve the \$250,000 returned to Hoopeston from Illinois' motor fuel tax. Kellie Ferrell seconded his motion.

MFT matters are usually brought up by the city's street/ alley department chairman, but that position became vacant when Jesse Gonzalez resigned from his Ward III seat.

During public comment, Roy Kohl, Hoopeston Emergency Management deputy director, asked the council to approve funding to fix the outdoor emergency siren at Sixth St. and East Elm, which has not worked since March 31. The repair is estimated at \$5,200, but Kohl said he can't see cost over people's safety.

He also asked whether, if officials decide to keep the sirens, an accrual fund, "for say, \$10,000," could be created to "take care of (things) in weeks instead of months."

Ald. Robin Lawson, who served as mayor pro tempore in Wise's absence, said the issue had been previously discussed, but "we kind of dropped that," she said. "We'll get it back on the front page."
