

## Largest ever state construction program includes local work

SPRINGFIELD - Gov. J.B. Pritzker on Friday unveiled the largest-ever construction program in state history that includes a couple of small projects in northern Vermilion County.

Pritzker announced the \$33.2 billion, multi-year program at the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) headquarters in Springfield. The new program is the first time in more than a decade that IDOT is releasing a comprehensive approach to invest in all modes of transportation: roads and bridges, aviation, transit, freight and passenger rail, waterways, as well as bicycle and pedestrian accommodations.

In IDOT District 5, which includes Vermilion County, \$30 million of the pot will be used for resurfacing 7.2 miles of I-74, ramp repairs, bridge replacements, bridge deck overlay and other improvements from US 150/ Illinois 1 to the Indiana state line.

Closer to home, \$1.5 million is earmarked to replace a bridge 1.9 miles south of Hoopeston. In the Bismarck area, \$8,500,000 is slated to replace a bridge over the east branch of the Vermilion River, west of Bismarck and \$500,000 for a bridge at Painter Creek, one-tenth mile south of Holloway Ave.

47.9 million spent of resurfacing 15.3 miles, bridge repairs, bridge deck overlay and additional improvements from the Ford County line to Buckley interchange and from Illinois 54 to U.S. 24.

According to a press release, the Fiscal Year 2024-29 Proposed Highway and Multimodal Improvement Program aims to invest \$27.03 billion in roads and bridges, with \$4.6 billion identified for the current fiscal year. A total of \$13.96 billion is programmed for other modes, which includes \$9.85 billion for transit, \$2.67 billion for freight and passenger rail, \$1.25 billion for aviation and \$190 million for ports and waterways. Projects are spread out across state and local transportation systems, touching each of the 102 counties in Illinois.

The release said that on the highways side, the program aims to improve 3,006 miles of roads and just over 9.8 million square feet of bridge deck on the state system, with anticipated funding maintaining 738 miles of roads and 1.1 million square feet of bridge deck for infrastructure overseen by local governments. Overall, the program will increase the investment in Illinois roads and bridges by \$2.43 billion over six years, due in part to engineering and planning efforts in the early years of Rebuild Illinois starting to result in more construction activity.


