ISA Field Talk to focus on nitrogen from legume cover crops

The results of a Hoopeston area farmer's ongoing study in using a cover crop to help save on nitrogen costs will be discussed at the upcoming Illinois Soybean Association Field Talk.

As an Illinois farmer, David Olson faced rising nitrogen bills. To alleviate this issue, he began to implement legume cover crops on his farm to produce nitrogen after wheat harvest.

Starting out, Olson had many questions about costs, synthetic fertilizer, yield and return on investment (ROI). To find answers, he collaborated with Jim Isermann of the Illinois Sustainable Ag Partnership to develop research plots on his farm for evaluation over a four- to five-year period. Doug Hanson, with Pro-Harvest Seeds, also assisted with soil and nitrate testing and selected cover crop species for the plots.

Illinois soybean farmers will have the opportunity to learn about this multiyear study at the ISA Field Talk from 9 a.m. until noon on September 9. During the event, Olson and a lineup of expert speakers will explain the first year of this study pertaining to legume cover crop after wheat and nitrogen management. The study aims to assess the cost, ROI and average yield of this multiyear legume cover crop and nitrogen management strategy.

Olson's farm is at 11342 E 4000 North Rd. The field is 3/4 mi. south of the farm.

Preregistration is required at ILSoyAdvisor.com. Lunch and CCA credits provided. The first 50 registrants will receive a free Illinois Soybean Association bag chair.
