Carol Arnold's legacy as children's librarian at Hoopeston Public Library was honored Monday, when library officials designated the children's room as the Mrs. Arnold Children's Room.

An etched glass panel above the doors to the children's room bears the new name and is backed by a curtain. Librarian Joann Charbonneau called the color Tiffany blue. "Carol loved Tiffany blue," she said.

Inside the room, a picture of Mrs. Arnold and the plaque

she received in 2016 for 45 years of service are displayed prominently by check-out counter.

Janelle Sechriest, hired in 2007 and who became coordinator when Mrs. Arnold retired in 2018, suggested the name change, which was approved within a couple of months after Mrs. Arnold's death in 2022, said library Director Tricia Freeland.

in glass took a little longer. Freeland said. "We ordered the glass from one company, had another person etch it, then back to the other company to install it," she said.

Mrs. Arnold was fondly remembered by library staff and guests at Monday's ceremony. Sechriest and Charbonneau each said they learned much from Mrs. Arnold. "She knew EVERYBODY. Sechriest said.

Saying working at the library "is the best job (she's) ever had in her life," Charbonneau said that while she didn't have formal training for her job, she spent a half day each week with Mrs. Arnold and learned how to "fix

"She ran me out of the toy room a couple of times," said Mayor Jeff Wise, who attended the ceremony with his granddaughter, who, he added, had not been run out.

Mrs. Arnold's career as children's librarian started in 1971 as a fluke.

Then-head librarian Louise Griner thought a resume for the position came from Mrs. Arnold and called her for an interview. The resume had not come from her, but Arnold got the job - and held it for 47 years, helping multiple generations of families learn to love reading.

She made reading a multi-faceted activity, making green eggs for the Dr. Seuss classic, "Green Eggs and Ham," or dressing up as a book character, like The Cat in the Hat. In 2001, Mrs. Arnold, dressed as The Cat, entertained not only youngsters at the library, but older folks, when she visited the former Country Terrace Independent Living Center.

When she wasn't working, Mrs. Arnold enjoyed traveling and shopping, and meeting new people, whether in person or by mail. For several years, Mrs. Arnold wrote letters to famous people, asking about their lives and what their favorite books were, keeping their responses in an album.
