## **Chicago blues comes to The Lorraine Theatre on Saturday**

Saturday's Night of Blues at the Lorraine Theatre is a homecoming for one of the four musicians who will be showcased at the event.

Hoopeston native John Chorney, who began playing piano at age six, contacted Lorraine board member Tami Goin to suggest a night of blues music at the theatre, offering to bring a couple musician friends along.

Regarded as a prodigy, Chorney frequently participated in piano competitions, culminating in a performance with the Danville Symphony. After graduating college, he relocated to the Chicago area, where he became immersed in the blues scene, mastering his craft and performing and recording with Chicago's elite blues artists.

He has also performed at prestigious music festivals nationally and abroad, and has contributed to critically acclaimed Delmark record releases, such as, "Michael Coleman and the Delmark Allstars," "Clark Street Ram-See BLUES on other side

blers," and "Put it on Me," by Quintus McCormick. A versatile musician, Chorney has made occasional forays into country music and collaborating with award-winning songwriter Dave Rudolph. He can be seen regularly performing with guitar virtuosos Luke Pytel and Derek Caruso, who will join him onstage at The Lorraine, along with local fan favorite. Catlin Crozier.

Caruso is a legitimate triple threat: not only a powerhouse guitarist (and equally proficient on drums) and vocalist, he also has impressive songwriting skills. Like Chorney, he pursued music at an early age. He has played in many successful regional groups and cracked the competitive Chicago market with his band, Derek Caruso and the Blues Fuse." Now, along with blues, he fronts his own successful reggae band, "Reggae Express."

Crozier's musical talent is in his bloodline. His dad, Chuck Crozier, and grandfather, Charlie Crozier, have been in bands over the years, as have great-uncles and cousins. Catlin has learned from them all. "It's always been my dream to have a country band with my dad (or Vince Gill - ha-ha) singing harmony," he said. "In all honesty, singing with my dad has always been a goal of mine. I am so blessed to be raised in this family with not only great musicians, but great people in general. Country music is his favorite genre to play, although he loves all kinds of music.

Luke Pytel will round out the sound Saturday. A Chicago recording artist, Pytel has earned a reputation as a solid, skillful guitarist and respected sideman. He has become a fixture in the Chicago blues scene, backing up talent like Jimmy Burns, Chico Banks and Ronnie Hicks. His efforts have allowed him to form his own band and forge his own sound. The Luke Pytel Band currently headlines major Chicago blues clubs, including Blue Chicago, Buddy Guy's Legends, and House of Blues.
