She was also a member of education organizations Phi Delta Kappa and Delta Kappa Gamma. Upon her graduation from Eastern Illinois University, she earned a special award as an outstanding teacher of early childhood education. Linda was a Cornjerker through and through.

A lifelong member of First Presbyterian Church in Hoopeston, Linda served as an Elder, Clerk of Session, and Deacon. She also sang in the church choir and rang in the handbell choir. This church has been her spiritual home and community.

Linda loved sharing a meal with friends, especially on Friday nights with the "teachers group." Although she experienced many health challenges, she rarely missed the opportunity to attend a concert, meet her friends, chase hot air balloons, or take a drive to enjoy the beautiful outdoors. Linda had a resilient spirit. If it's true that a person shows us who they really are in crisis, in her last year, she revealed just how big her heart was and modeled how to keep on going even when the going gets tough. Her passing leaves a big hole in the lives of her family and friends. In Linda's memory, please take a moment to help someone who needs an extra boost.
