Hoopeston Christmas Day dinner canceled, church to host Christmas luncheon December 23

When one door closes, often, another opens, and so it is with Hoopeston's free community Christmas din-

Susan Comstock started the tradition in 2012, wanting no one to be alone on Christmas. Tapping into the community, she found volunteers to cook turkeys and make casseroles, side dishes and desserts. Others donated paper products for the dinner, which was first served at the Hoopeston Multi Agency and later moved to Hoopeston United Methodist Church.

Even COVID could not stop the Christmas Day Dinner from happening. Barred from meeting in a group, volunteers bagged meals and delivered them to

residents all around the town.

This year, Comstock wrestled with whether to hold the dinner. Having had hip replacement surgery earlier this year - and having a hard time slowing the frenetic pace at which she does things - Comstock did not feel up to the challenge, but didn't want to disappoint those who looked forward to the event. "This would have been the 12 straight years," she said. "It was very hard to come to not doing it as still have some that have come ever year," she said. "A lot have died, which is sad."

She had not started working on this year's dinner, then learned she didn't have to.

Instead, Micah Mobley, pastor at Hoopeston First Church of God, announced on the church Facebook page that it would hold a free Christmas lunch at the church, 1004 E. Orange.

Mobley, who returned to Hoopeston a couple of months ago from Huntington, Ind., said after learning a Christmas dinner had not yet been scheduled this year, felt led to do one. "That kind of started all of this - what can we do to be a light in the community just to bless people, so here we go and much ore to come because God is good!," he said.
