Downtown restoration keeps focus on positive in 2023

A Look Back At

It's difficult to find one word that sums up Hoopeston in 2023. In large part, a single word would depend on what one focuses on.

For example, looking at the downtown and its multiple dilapidated buildings, a person might chose words like "poverty," or "decay."

Others look on a brighter side and are fighting back against the negative image, focusing instead on "Regeneration."

A quiet pushback is being waged by downtown business owners who are banding together to promote each other's

2023 saw the formation of Visit Downtown Hoopeston, Inc., a registered not-for-profit corporation, with Emily Brown as its registered agent.

businesses in an effort to attract more customers.

The group was registered in August and has a presence on Facebook, where it updates sales, special events and other activities at downtown businesses. Its Facebook

page says "Visit Downtown Hoopeston is a group of downtown business owners in Hoopeston, IL dedicated to supporting each other and building up our historic downtown. Downtown

> Hoopeston is quickly developing into an up and coming destination with unique shopping and dining," and urges people to follow the page "to get all the updates on beloved downtown Hoopeston businesses and events in the downtown area."

Then, too, the downtown had a small explosion of new business-

es this year, with the addition of two shops offering collectibles, a candy shop and a tire business.

The Lorraine Foundation, owner of the theaters and two other buildings on Main St., lost two tenants this year. Stay Awhile moved to Rt. 9 and expanded its offerings to include ice cream. The second, Main Street Parlor, closed its doors next to the Little Lorraine but is plan-

ning to reopen its candy and soda business after updating its new location at 109 E. Main, next door to Pizza King.

Soon, there will be more room for businesses or other entities in the downtown, as nine structures are slated for demolition. That work began last week at the former Hoopeston Food Locker and is expected to continue this week with buildings in the 200 block of East Main, east of the Doyle Law Office and south on Market to include two buildings south of the former Kelley's Pub. The former Lester Drugs, which was boarded up last year, is also slated for the wrecking ball.

In the 300 block of East Main, the former Chronicle building is set to also be demolished.

The price to remove the decrepit structures is \$473,400 and will come from the city's tax increment financing (TIF) fund.

In other business news last year, a new Tractor Supply store opened in the former Pamida building at Hoopeston Plaza while Express Lube, also in the plaza, closed.

According to reports, a larger oil change business purchased the chain of Express Lubes, including ones

in Danville, Watseka and Rantoul, but did not include Hoopeston.

Other highlights from last year included:

- Hoopeston water/sewer ran a close second to crumbling buildings in the number of stories for 2023. Among them was approval of a \$3 million loan to upgrade and repair the water system and water treatment plant. The grant was originally to include main replacement on Market from Main to Honeywell, but due to rising costs, that part of the project will not be done with loan funds.
- Water and sewer rates were hiked 25 percent in 2023 and will see a 20 percent increase this year to keep the department in the black.
- Hoopeston Area School District generated interest with the addition of two electric buses to its fleet. The buses were delivered November 1. An EPA grant paid for the busses and charging stations. Through a \$748,892 grant.
- Longtime children's librarian Carol Arnold was honored when the children's library was renamed the Mrs. Arnold Children's Room in October.
- Incorporated in 1938, the Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce folded in 2023.
