accept donations of larger items, such as lift chairs, patient lifts, power scooters and more. However, because of limited storage space, Eyrich said they try to quickly find homes for these items in the community and even in nursing homes.

"These larger items are quite expensive to purchase and can make a huge difference in a person quality of life and care," she said. "In many cases these items can be the big reason someone can live comfortably with in their homes rather than in care facilities."
