Hoopeston Area Athletic Hall of Fame to add nine names to roster at induction ceremony

The Hoopeston Area Athletic Hall of Fame will grow

by nine entries when the class of 2024 is officially inducted on February 2. The public is invited to attend the induction ceremony at approximately 7 p.m. Friday, between the JV and varsity basketball games. Those being inducted this year include:

Mark Alt, a two-time IHSA All-State performer, winning an IHSA State Championship as a member of the 880 yd. relay

team, and also as an IHSA State Finals runner-up as a member of the 440 yd. relay team, earned 10 Varsity letters while representing the Cornjerkers in the 1970s, earning four letters in basketball, four in track & field, and two in baseball. Alt won over 20 individual and relay championships at the county, conference, invitational, and district levels and held seven school records, including three in the 880 Relay, two in the 440 Relay and twice in the 120 yd. high hurdles. The hurdles record stood for 28 seasons.

Larry Davis, who taught history and coached high school football for 30 years. Davis taught at Winola, Anna-Jonesboro, Mt. Carmel, Sullivan and Geneva. In his

physical educator when John Greer was a middle school, and she remained tethered to the John Greer gymnasium until her retirement in 2003. She coached middle school volleyball (1986-1999; 2002-2009), basketball (1987-1988), and sixth grade relay track teams. Duffin's legacy to Cornjerker athletics is her investment in the young people of the community. She introduced them to sports, developed their fundamentals, and created an atmosphere that inspired lifelong learning.

Erika (Ramos) Seidel was a stand-out at Hoopeston Area High School in track and cross country. She won the 800-meter run all four years and remains the County and Vermilion Valley Conference record-holder in the 800-meter run with times of 2:24.2 and 2:22.74, respectively. Seidel broke the 30vear record (set in 1989) at the All-Area News-Gazette track meet at the University of Illinois with a time of 2:17. She qualified for the state track meet all four years in the 800-meter run. She placed seventh and fifth, respectively, in 2008 and 2009 and earned all-state honors in cross country her junior and senior years.

Seidel competed for Eastern Illinois University from 2009-2013. In college, she was a two-sport athlete, competing for EIU in cross country, indoor track, and outdoor track. She was a 14-time All-Ohio Valley Conference winner for both sports. Erika has held records in events such as 6k, mile run, distance medley relay, 4x400 meter

relay (indoor), and 4x800 meter relay (outdoor).

Gary Shoufler qualified for the IHSA State Wrestling Tournament three times, highlighted by a second place finish his senior year, leading his team to a fifth place overall finish in the team standings. That fifth place finish is the highest finish ever for a Hoopeston wrestling team. He won three Individual IH-SA District Championships, two IHSA Sectional Championships, was a two-time Wauseca Conference Champion, two-time champion at the Normal Community Tour-

nament, and also won the Stillman Valley Tournament title. He set school records for "reversals" and "most wins," along with being the first Cornjerker wrestler to notch 100 career wins. Upon graduation, his 102 wins made him Hoopeston's "All-time winningest wrestler.

Marissa (Bushue) Smiley played varsity volleyball, basketball, and track all four years.

In volleyball, she was named All County, first team All-Area, and special mention All-State.

basketball, she In played on the team that won sectionals. She made the 1.000 point

club and was named first team All-Area, and special mention All-State.

In track, she finished second and third in state in the triple jump and fourth in the long jump, receiving allstate honors. At EIU, she set the triple jump record of 40 ft. 7.25 in. and has a top 10 EIU long jump of 18ft. 8.75 in.

Matthew Smiley, a member of the class of 1997, was a four-sport athlete, lettering one year in wrestling, two in basketball, three in football and four years in track. He qualified for the state track and field meet three years in four different events. His senior season, he advanced to the state track finals in the 300 hurdles.

Smiley began to coach college football fulltime with stops around the country. In 2013, he got his break in the NFL with the Jacksonville Jaguars as their special teams' assistant. After four years with Jacksonville, he went to work with the Buffalo Bills in the same role. In 2022 he was elevated to the Special Teams Coordinator with the Bills. That same season his Buffalo Bills Special Teams unit ranked number 1 in the NFL.

The 1984 boys' basketball team was the first basketball team from Hoopeston to advance to the Assembly Hall, making it to the IHSA State Tournament's "Elite Eight". They won the Pontiac Super-Sectional over Toluca, 51-48 in overtime. They were Watseka Sectional champions and Armstrong Regional champions, along with winning the Cornjerker Classic Tournament. They finished the season with a record of 26 and six. Four players went on to play college basketball.
