Council expected to act on deal for hotel water/sewer, road

Hoopeston City Council will hold a special meeting Tuesday to vote on whether the city will pay for water infrastructure and a road for a planned hotel.

The meeting will include discussion and possible action on a development agreement between the city and the investment group headed by Russ Leigh.

Under the proposed agreement, the development will be sited on 3.52 acres along Rt. 9, west of Hoopeston Marathon. Development is set to include a hotel of not less than 42 rooms, a restaurant, storage facility, strip mall, and a retaining pond, if necessary.

The city's part of the project will be to install water infrastructure on the property and a road connecting the property to Elm St.

The main entrance to the development will be located on Rt. 9.

City officials have earmarked \$50,000 of tax increment financing (TIF) funds and \$200,000 from city ARPA (American Rescue Act of 2021) funds the federal government distributed in response to the COVID pandemic. An additional \$600,000 will come from Vermilion County ARPA funds.

The \$850,000 is enough to cover the water/sewer costs and a large part of the road, said Mayor Jeff Wise. "That's all the City can do though," he said. "We do not have any other funds available.'

A clock is ticking on the county's share of the money. If an agreement with the developer cannot be reached, Hoopeston has to return the county money this fall, Wise said. "In my opinion, this is the last best hope for a hotel near the intersection of Rt. 1 and 9. This amazing \$600,000 gift from the County won't happen again," he

Hoopeston officials have hoped to draw a motel or hotel to the city since 2003, when then-Mayor Chalmers Flint said getting a motel on Rtes. 1 and 9 was his dream, one that "looks like an uphill battle at this point."

In December 2003, Flint announced a Chicago developer was interested in a project but potential environmental issues were feared.

In 2005, Mayor Bill DeWitt announced Hoopeston took possession of the Baer's Hotel and Trailer Park, paying \$125,000 for the property. An owner of two motels in Danville was interested in developing a Hoopeston motel and, in October 2005, bid \$1 for 4.458 acres of the Baer property. That developer withdrew his interest in a local

In 2008, talk of a motel was resurrected and an agreement signed with a Monticello man planning to open an independent motel, which also failed to materialize.

In 2010, Mayor Bill Crusinberry told the city no progress would be possible on a motel because banks were not loaning for motel construction and chains were not planning new construction, either. That same year, the city paid \$7,000 for a feasibility study that showed Hoopeston could support a 40-room motel.

Six years later, Crusinberry told the council that Cobblestone Hotels, which had previously declined to consider putting a motel in Hoopeston, contacted Crusinberry, expressing interest.

In 2017, Russ Leigh bought the land where the hotel is planned to be sited, purchasing it from Hoopeston Retirement Village Foundation.

The meeting will be held at 7 p.m. at city hall. It is open to the public. A complete agenda and Zoom link are at cityofhoopeston.com.
