"I really enjoyed the first festival that I chaired," she said, calling it "a big learning experience." With that knowledge under her belt, she said a second go-round "allows you to relax a little more and enjoy the ups and downs you go through planning and setting up the festival. will provide carnival rides and games. "As an organization, we are looking forward to what they will be bringing," she said.

Connor Family Amusements will have ride specials each day: from 5-10 p.m. Thursday, 5-11 p.m. Friday and 12-4 p.m. and 5-11 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, and 12-4 p.m. and 5-9 p.m. Monday. Four-day ride passes (Thursday-Sunday) are available for \$60 (a \$180 value) and may be purchased at Kirby Foods, Mary's Clothesline and Burger Bank.

In light of rising prices in recent years, Hoopeston Jaycees have tried new things to keep the festival afloat. In 2023, the group implemented a 50/50 drawing. Last years haul netted \$798.50 for both the winner and Jaycees. Tickets are one for \$1, six for \$5 and 30 for \$20 and are available at The Burger Bank, 201 E. Penn.

A new donation program launched this year will offset the cost of providing free sweetcorn to festival guests.

In honor of the 80th anniversary, the "Field of Corn" program asked for donors to pay \$80 toward the corn cost. Donors names will be placed on signs that look like ears of corn that will be placed near the corn line. Donors may keep their sigs at the end of the festival.

The hot buttered vegetable is spendy. In recent years, corn is billed by the crate. Hardcastle said the Jaycees purchase 1.008 crates, each containing about four dozen ears, for about 48,384 ears total. She will not know how much this year's corn will cost until it is delivered because the cost is based on market price at the time. The Jaycees have an estimated cost of \$13,104 for this year's corn and are hoping this year is better than last.

In the last couple of years, the cost of corn has fluctuated a lot, she said, adding last year's cost ended up at \$20,369.62, "the highest we have ever paid."

The festival began in 1941 and has been held annually except for during WWII and during COVID in 2020.
