



City, school election packets available for April 2025 race

Residents interested in running for Hoopeston City Council or Hoopeston Area Board of Education may pick up petition packets and begin gathering signatures.

For the municipal election, packets are available at Hoopeston City Hall 301 W. Main St., during operating hours, 8 a.m.-3 p.m. Monday-Thursday and 8 a.m.-1 p.m. Friday.

Positions up for election include mayor and one alderman in each of the city's four wards. Current officeholders are Mayor Jeff Wise, a vacant seat in Ward I, previously held by Nicole Van Hyfte; Ward II seat held by Kellie Ferrell; Ward III slot held by Tim Scharlach and in Ward IV, the seat currently held by Bob Porth. All are for four-year terms.

Hoopeston Area voters will be selecting four board members. Those seats are currently held by Debbie Klaber, Cheryl Steiner, Elizabeth Silver, and Travis Field.

Packets for the school board are available at the County Administration Building in Danville, or potential candidates may call (217) 554-1900 or by email www.ver county.org to request a packet be emailed.

This will be the first school board election held under the at-large system for candidates approved by voters last year.

Previously, four board members were selected from Grant Township 23N Range 12W congressional township and the remaining three from other townships in the school district, which includes Vermilion, Iroquois and Ford counties.

The change was requested and approved by voters because of the difficulty in finding candidates outside of Grant Township 23N Range 12W.

Supt. Robert Richardson said an important thing for board candidates to remember is petitions are to be filed November 12-18, moved up approximately six weeks.
