# Indiana deputy in critical condition after shooting near Sheldon

A police pursuit that started in Iroquois County has left an Indiana deputy in critical condition and the alleged suspect dead.

According to reports from police agencies, the incident occurred the evening of September 1, when Iroquois County deputies were pursuing what was described as an armed suspect with a hostage. The pursuit went into Newton County, Ind., when that sheriff's department also became involved.

The chase returned to Illinois when the suspect, 37-year-old Andrew Roselius, of Clifton, crashed in Sheldon.

According to reports, Roselius left his vehicle and gunfire was exchanged, killing Roselius and critically injuring Newton County Corporal Brandon Schreiber.

Corporal Schreiber, a five-year department veteran, was taken to Iroquois Memorials Hospital in Watseka

and was air lifted to Carle Hospital in Urbana, where he was listed in critical condition.

No hostage was found in Roselius' car.

At 8:45 p.m. Sunday, Iroquois County Sheriff's Department requested Illinois State Police to investigate the incident. According to police reports, once ISP completes their investigation, results will be given to the Iroquois County State's Attorney's office.

Newton County Sheriff's Department issued a statement, expressing "heartfelt gratitude for the overwhelming support and prayers from our law enforcement families, both from Indiana and Illinois, as well as from our community. Your kindness is deeply appreciated and means more than words can express."
