Anderson's Check 'N Out tops national pull competition

It was a year of ups and downs but in the end. Ryan Anderson and his 1972 International 1256 were on top of the competition at the DeKalb County Fair NTPA Grand Nationals, held September 5-7 in Sandwich, IL.

Pulling in the Hi Torque GN Super Farm Tractors category, the difference between first and second place was this close, with Anderson pulling 341.935 and Jon Silsby, of Union City, Mich., at 341.385.

Anderson went into the final two hooks of the season two points behind the NTPA Grand National Super Farm points leader. A first place win Saturday afternoon left Team Check 'N Out gaining three points, leaving them with a one point lead going into Saturday night pulls.

At the tail end of the draw, Anderson and his team watched tractor after tractor, waiting for their shot. "We stayed the course and ran our tractor the way we know how," Anderson said. "Our run went smoothly, giving us our second first place finish of the day and making our team the 2024 NTPA Grand National Superfarm Champion!

This is the second Grand National Anderson and his team has earned. The first was in 2021. The win put the

team's season with five first place finishes, one second place and three finishes outside the Top 5.

Several family members and friends were on hand to witness the win. This season, which had its share of struggles, was dedicated to David Anderson, Ryan's dad and one of his biggest supporters. Mr. Anderson died in March 2023.

Anderson might be the man in the driver's seat but he knows his team plays a large part in the success of Check 'N Out.

After the win, Anderson thanked his sponsors, Greene Stairs, Super Rooster Motorsports, Apex Turbo Salenbien Performance, Corsa Data Acquisition, CM Pulling Tires, Pro Puller Tires, BAD Gear and Wimer Fuel Injection.

He also thanked his crew - Robert Danner, DJ McCalla and Justin Jeffries - for "all the hours, blood, sweat and tears you put into this team," his family: wife, Megan, daughter Faith "and all the family who supports us, pulls with us and prays with us and for us.

"We'll take some time to rest, look back and reflect on this season, then on to 2025!"
