Lorraine Theatre to host first movie showing February 13

It's been a long time in coming but the wait is almost

On Thursday, February 13, Captain America: Brave New World will be the first of first run movies shown at newly-upgraded Lorraine Theatre.

"It's been a long haul," said Alex Houmes, Lorraine Foundation president, "It's finally happening and we're excited about it!"

Movies will be shown Fridays and Saturdays at 7 p.m. and 2 p.m. Sundays. Audiences will have "the latest and greatest" theater experience, with BARCO Laser Projection and Dolby Atoms Sound systems, Houmes said. "It will be a premium screening experience."

The new audio and visual equipment cost \$150,000,

partly paid with a \$40,667 T-Mobile Hometown grant awarded to the theater last year.

The foundation looked into having the audio professionally installed but the quote for \$55,000 made them think again. "My dad (Eric Houmes) and I took it upon ourselves to install it," Houmes said. "If it wasn't for him and his expertise, we wouldn't be opening."

Pablo Diaz Construction was hired to help the last couple of days of installation, as well.

Installing the speakers took some muscle. The smallest speakers weighed 50-60 lbs., Houmes said. The men ended up installing 32 surround speakers, five sub woofers and three main speakers behind the screen. Houmes noted the additional speakers aren't for extra volume but to provide the 3D effect for the projector.

The plan is to solely host movies for six months, adding a Wednesday showing at some point. The Wednesday movie will not be a first-run showing, but will be like Wednesday movies at the Little Lorraine: older films with staying power. Residents will be able to suggest titles to show, or churches could request a screening of a faithbased movie. After the six-months, Houmes wants to start working in other events, creating "a movie theater with live events mixed in," such as tribute bands, plays and other entertainment.

to Tuesdays starting February 11.

Hoopeston residents often travel to other places to purchase their needs but in the case of movies, Hoopeston may see an influx of out-of-town patrons.

Ticket prices will be \$8 for adults, \$7 for senior citizens and \$6 for children ages 3-11 for a premium viewing experience, Houmes said, adding that a standard screen at a theater chain in Champaign charges \$16 for adults, \$14 for seniors and \$12 for kids.

Concessions will be roughly 40 percent less than their Champaign counterparts.

For the first week of *Captain America: Brave New World*, ticket sales will be online, available at lorrainetheatre.com. In-person and online sales will be available for subsequent weeks and other films, Houmes said.

Since the Lorraine Foundation took ownership of the large theatre, as well as the Little Lorraine, in 2013. Realizing the Lorraine needed work, the foundation began showing movies at the smaller venue while the grand theater received needed attention.

Along the way, the foundation board took on other buildings, including buildings adjacent to the Little Lorraine, the Willdon Building and the former city hall. In recent years, the foundation divested itself of those build-



ings and by late last year, was back to focusing on its crown jewel.

With the latest and greatest picture and sound, one might think Lorraine volunteers could take a break, but the theater that showed its first movie in 1922 is also showing its age. There is wiring work to do, the seating system and exterior doors need to be replaced and "even with a new roof, we still have water issues," Houmes said, adding the parapets will have to be capped.

Houmes is still adjusting to the fact that the Lorraine will again show movies. Asked what drives him to keep improving the showplace, "I lived behind the theater for
