




Charles Landers, 57, of Hoopeston, was arrested at 5:39 p.m. Sunday for an incident at 11:22 p.m. Saturday.

Hoopeston Fire Department was called at 2:28 a.m. Sunday to the house, at 827 E. Seminary. According to county records, the house is owned by Shenoa Underwood, of Danville.

Fire Chief Joel Bird said firemen arrived on the scene at 2:32 a.m. to find the house fully engulfed. Due to the previous fires, officials had been trying to get the building condemned, but in order to extinguish the fire and for safety, the structure was excavated, Bird said.

The cause of the fire is undetermined at this time, Bird said. Firemen cleared the scene at 8 a.m.
