Flores is state champ, Zamora ends career with 3rd

Hoopeston Area junior Charlie Flores didn't hold back in his wrestling or his joy at earning first place in the 106

lb. category at Saturday's IHSA wrestling finals.

The championship was low-scoring, locked at zero for the first two periods. An escape got Flores on the board in the third and a takedown seconds before the match ended, put him on top of the contest. He won by a 4-0 decision over his opponent - and offseason training partner - sophomore Steven Uden of Oakwood/Salt Fork, who beat Flores during the regular season.

After lapping the mat at the State Farm Center in Champaign, Flores shook Uden's hand, then threw himself headlong at assistant coach Felipe Martinez, in a continuation of the state contest tradition of the athlete flipping his coach onto the mat.

A former Cornjerker wrestler who placed third at state his senior year, Martinez was able to fend off Flores' attempt and the two hugged each other tightly.

Hoopeston's water plant among those testing for lithium levels

Officials say residents are not in danger Hoopeston's water supply is among others currently

testing to determine safe levels for unregulated contaminants in the water supply.

Unregulated contaminants are those which don't yet have a drinking water standard set by the Environmental Protection Agency. Through testing, officials hope to set standards for the substances.

One substance Hoopeston water is being tested for is lithium, an alkali metal that occurs naturally in some groundwater where the groundwater interacts with lithium -containing minerals or saline water, according to information from the U.S. Geological Survey. Research by USGS and the Environmental Protection Agency identified 10 micrograms of lithium per liter of water as a healthy-based screening level.
