Iroquois County deputies injured in arrest of Milford man

SAFE-T Act cited as reason for release

WATSEKA-Two Iroquois County deputies were injured last Thursday after police conducted a traffic stop in rural Sheldon. The stop was conducted after a vehicle, driven by Suzett K. Fassoth, 49, of Milford, failed to use a turn signal. Deputies approached the vehicle, making contact with Fassoth and a front seat passenger, identified as Terry L Gardner, 58, also of Milford.

According to a press release issued by the sheriff's department, deputies conducted a lawful search of the vehicle and discovered a white powdery substance, suspected to be cocaine, along with various pieces of drug paraphernalia under Gardner's seat.

Deputies approached Gardner to attempt to place him in custody at which time, Gardner began to actively resist and fight with deputies, according to the release. At one

point, Gardner attempted - but failed - to gain control of a deputies Taser. Garner was eventually successfully placed in handcuffs. Both deputies were injured in the altercation.

Gardner was transported to the Iroquois County Jail where he again physically fought with corrections staff, refused to be photographed or fingerprinted, and refused to change into a jail uniform when requested by corrections staff, according to the news release.

He is facing preliminary charges of possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, two counts of aggravated battery to a peace officer and attempting to disarm a peace officer. He was held pending a pretrial detention hearing. Due to provisions in the SAFE-T Act, he was required to be released from custody with a pending court date, according to the press release.

"Due to the SAFE-T act, a violent criminal, who physically fought with and injured deputies, attempting to disarm one, was released back into the public. Gardner has demonstrated his disregard for the law and willingness to avoid arrest at great cost. Gardner's release and his conduct creates a dangerous environment for law enforcement and the general public," the press release said.

Fassoth was arrested without incident on preliminary charges of possession of a controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia. She was later released with a notice to appear.




